Field Day Guidelines

On May 22, 2018, Fairview will be holding their annual field day which will be college-themed. This is a fun-filled day that our students look forward to. It is our desire that each and every child participate. However, students who have excessive inappropriate behavior will not be allowed to participate. We will use a **“three strikes and you're out”** system. If a student is sent to the office for a serious behavior offense (**as determined by the administration**), that student will be charged with a strike. The office will keep track of the strikes and update teachers on a regular basis. Please contact your child's teacher if you have questions. If a child receives a full day of in-school suspension or any out-of-school suspension (as assigned by the office), they will automatically be removed from participating in field day.

If students are behind in getting their work completed and turned in, this poor choice may result in the loss of field day participation. Students will be given an opportunity to work on incomplete work in the Media Center and once the work is completed to the best of their ability, they will be allowed to join the field day festivities. Please discuss these guidelines with your child. If you think that your child may be behind and may lose field day, please contact your child's teacher. **Your child should be very aware if they have incomplete work, so it should be no surprise, should they find themselves sitting in the Media Center on field day.**
